## **Brief History**

One of the first school districts in Illinois, District 87 was formed in 1857, when it hired Abraham Lincoln for some legal work. Bloomington public high school occupied the second floor of the old Wilkins' Seminary for its first year, and moved to another building in 1858. The first graduating class consisted of two members in 1864, and by 1877 contained over thirty students.

The first building dedicated to high school education was at the corner of Evans and Taylor streets, where it occupied the upper floor. In 1867 it moved again to the upper floor of the building on the corner of Empire and Park streets.

In 1869, the second Bloomington High School was built on the corner of Monroe and Oak streets (now between Prairie and Gridley streets on Monroe). The Romanesque Revival-style building was designed by local architects William Reeves and John Bailee and featured a cross-gable roof, masonry walls and a tall corner tower. It was dedicated in January 1897 and used until 1917. The building burned in 1933 and was demolished. The third edifice of Bloomington High School, designed by local architect Arthur Pillsbury, was built between 1915 and 1917. Of all the buildings housing the high school, this is the oldest still standing, at 510 E. Washington Street, and was the city's only public high school for more than 40 years. The building was added to the National Register of Historic Places on April 19, 2018

The present Bloomington High School, located at 1202 East Locust Street in Bloomington, opened in 1959. The lead designer was Normal native A. Richard Williams. During his distinguished career in the firm of Lundeen and Hilfinger, Williams established the Mid-Continent Modern style of architecture, characterized by minimalist simplicity, functional pragmatism, and environmental harmony. Bloomington High School is an exemplar of the International Style of architecture. Design elements include the flat roof, large expanse of windows, metal casements, slender columns, and absence of architectural embellishments. The most striking feature is the gym's "scalloped" cantilevered trusses. In 1967, district voters approved a \$5.3 million bond referendum, with about \$3.1 million of that set aside to double the size of the existing high school.

In 2020, almost 1390 students were enrolled at Bloomington High School in grades 9-12. Athletics include a full range of individual and team sports, including football, basketball, baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball, tennis, swimming, diving, wrestling, track and field, cross country, golf, cheerleading, and pompons. School clubs also meet on a wide range of topics. The school's colors are purple and gold. The school dropped its mascot, a Native American chief head, in 2001 because it was deemed offensive. The students of the school at that time voted not to replace the mascot but to still be called the Purple Raiders.

## **Scope**

Initial folders in this collection contain documents relating to construction and dedication of the three buildings devoted to Bloomington High School. Subsequent folders include course

descriptions and handbooks; issues of *The Aegis* newspaper; programs from music, dance and theater productions; commencement and graduation events; and programs for basketball and football games.
